

• Research and Publication Ethics (RPE)-Course for awareness about the publication ethics and publication misconducts.

Course Level:

• 2 Credit course (30 hrs.)

About the course

Course Code: CPE-RPE

Overview

This course has total 6 units focusing on basics of philosophy of science and ethics, research integrity, publication ethics. Hands-on-sessions are designed to identify research misconduct and predatory publications. Indexing and citation databases, open access publications, research metrics (citations, h-index, Impact Factor, etc.) and plagiarism tools will be introduced in this course.

Pedagogy:

Class room teaching, guest lectures, group discussions, and practical sessions.

Evaluation

• Continuous assessment will be done through tutorials, assignments, quizzes, and group discussions. Weightage will be given for active participation. Final written examination will be conducted at the end of the course.

 - 5. Selective reporting and misrepresentation of data

To include "Research and Publication Ethics" (RPE) as a compulsory course for all Ph.D. scholars, as part of the course work, from the forthcoming academic session, as notified by the UGC vide letter D.O.No. F.1-1/2018 (Journal/CARE), December, 2019.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

The Committee has carefully gone through the UGC notification on including "Research and Publication Ethics" as a compulsory course for all Ph.D. scholars and recommended the following:

- 1. To provide awareness about the publication ethics and publication misconducts, "Research and Publication Ethics" can be included as a compulsory course, as a part of course work for all Ph.D. Scholars (both full-time and part-time), who have joined on or after 01.06.2020.
- 2. The course can be conducted either online or off-line mode based on the prevailing situation.
- 3. A fee of Rs. 2,000 can be fixed for this course work, in addition to the existing coursework fee.
- 4. A honorarium of Rs.1,000 per hour can be paid to the experts for handling classes for this course.
- 5. The office of the Dean-Research can be permitted to coordinate and workout modalities to implement this course by following the structure given by the UGC.

6. RPE need to be included as one of the papers in the course structure of the Ph.D., Programme and the examination for the same can be conducted as per the existing norms.
